Graduation Requirements

Twenty-five units of class work which must include: English 4, Social Studies 4, Theology 4, Math 4, Science 3, Foreign Language 2, Fine Arts 2, P. E. 2. The entire curriculum is college preparatory.

Advanced Placement Courses

Calculus, Statistics, Computer Principles, Physics, Chemistry, US History, Modern European History, American Government, English Literature and Spanish

Honors Courses

Algebra/Geometry I, Geometry, Algebra II, Pre-Calculus, Biology, Chemistry, Economics, American Literature III and English IV.

Dual Enrollment

Students may elect to earn college credit for Calculus I, II through Creighton University; AP US History and Spanish IV through Wesleyan University.

Community Service Program

All students are required to complete 70 hours of community service for graduation. Many are involved in community service in various agencies in Omaha, and some participate in the Network of Sacred Heart Schools service projects. Seventy percent of the requirement for community service is direct person-to-person involvement in agencies which serve the marginalized population.

Exchange Program

The Sacred Heart Exchange Program permits students to study for four weeks at a Sacred Heart school in another state or foreign country. It provides a unique opportunity to broaden horizons, both academically and socially.

Special Awards

Barat Service is given to those students who have made service a part of their lives and have generously shared time and talent. **Très Bien** recognizes students who raise their averages in a class at least five points, while maintaining all other class averages. **Mes Amis Award** is given to students who continually reach out to others in their class and in the school community. As a result, they strengthen Duchesne Academy. Prizes are given in class for high academic achievement.

Placement in Class

Duchesne Academy has a strong academic program and a small senior class. Because of the small, homogeneous nature of our student body, we do not rank students. All subjects for which credit is given are included in the average. Honors and AP courses are given three percentage points more credit. A student's performance in relation to her class is indicated by a frequency distribution instead of class rank. Because we only admit students able to do college-preparatory work and because classes are small, there is generally a small range in students' grade averages.
